That National President and Secretary-Treasurer be elected. Moved Bruce Mitchell, seconded Jim McFarlane carried.

PRESIDENT:

After some discussion Weith Mazell stated that J. Nightingale of N.S.W., although not present, had intimated his willingness to take this position. His nomination was accepted and Bruce Nitchell the only other nominee, having stood down J. Nightingale was appointed President.

SECRETARY-TREASURER:

The Chairman and minute secretary appointed for this meeting were asked to continue in this capacity for the duration of this meeting.

TLIGIBILITY OF CO.PETITORS FOR TOUR WAYELITS:

PINANCE:

NEXT VENUE:

That Western Australia be invited to hold 1979 National Championships and to be asked for a prompt reply. Moved Keith Hazell, seconded Bob Marshall carried.

Ian Murphy stated that Victoria would be willing to hold the 1979 event if Western Australia were unable to do so.

In closing the meeting Des Gibbs moved a vote of thanks to Ian Murphy for being instrumental in getting the National Championships under way. Carried with acclamation.
